YOUTH EDUCATION UPDATE – Tommy Fairweather

One of the Church's important missions is the education of the young people in our parish; they will be the next generation of parishioners. Prior to my taking the vestry position of Youth Education, a plan had been developed under Jeanne Kellogg's leadership unifying our Christian Education program. Like all plans, implementation depends on the people who make the decision to help. The **purpose of this message** is to let every member know the positions currently needing to be filled and a little information about the expectations of these positions. One of these is a paid position that has been budgeted in the 2012 budget.

YOUTH DIRECTOR is a paid and part-time position requiring about 20 hours a week. The person will lead, supervise and support the following people:

Superintendent of Sunday School, Bible School Director,
Children's Chapel Director and the EYC director.

For more information about this position or would like to apply for the job, please call Father Cooper.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL – a volunteer position. Their duties will be to supervise and support each of the teachers of the Sunday School Classes. The materials for the three class levels has been ordered. The materials for these classes have been paid for by a grant and with the financial help of the Vestry of Christ the King. The classes will include:

- 1 Nursery – ages 0-4.
- 2 The Felt Class -- ages 5-10. Mary Blake Williams is the lead teacher for this class with the assistance of Katherine Tait, Krissi Finch, and Genevieve Torrey.
- 3 The Workshop Class is for children 11 and up, and until May, will be led by Jeanne Kellogg.
- 4 In the fall, the Rite 13 class will begin for Grades 6 - 8.
I will be calling some of you to ask you to volunteer to help with the Rite 13 program. According to the curriculum, this class should be led by a man and women that are not married to each other. Since Jeanne has agreed to be one of these teachers, I will need three more adults to help with this program.

If there are two sets of two teachers to handle two weekends a month, it would allow time for you to attend adult Sunday School and could prevent possible teacher “burn out”.

Sunday school is held between 9:15 to 10:15 during the school year.

- 5 EYC will be an offspring next year of the Rite 13. However, I am asking for volunteers to take some meetings until May of this year. Once EYC restarts, it will meet every Sunday evening at for about 1 hour.

The focus of this time can be socialization and perhaps service oriented.

If you could volunteer for at least one Sunday evening a month as leader of EYC, please contact me immediately at 269-9861.

COORDINATOR OF CHILDREN'S CHAPEL is another way that you can volunteer and help with the education of the young children in our parish. The coordinator will be responsible for training the individuals who take on Children's Chapel and maintaining the schedule so that there is a person available every Sunday. Children's Chapel takes place at the beginning of the 10:30 service.

Children's chapel is for children ages four through ten. Children older than this should remain with their parents. The children leave the main church and go to a service where they learn about the scriptures being taught in the regular service, but at their own level. The teacher provides cookies and drink after their lesson, and then the group returns to the church during The Peace to worship with their parents for the rest of the service.

We are pleased that, for the time being, Lyn Smith has agreed to take this position of coordinator. We are looking for more volunteers to help with this activity. To alleviate possible burn-out issues, if twelve people volunteered, they would do it only once a month.

DIRECTOR OF VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL -- will need to be filled during the early spring. Having participated for several years as a teacher, I can tell you it is a wonderful learning opportunity for children and a joy for the adults to watch them learn.

Prior directors, Mary Blake Williams, Lyn Smith, Jodee Hart, and Pat Dean, are excellent resources of past year's programs -- the mountains and pitfalls of information learned. The Education Committee will meet and select the date and curriculum for the Vacation Bible School.

The Director of Vacation Bible School will coordinate the volunteers to fill the jobs required by the curriculum.

During this one week, there can be many ways that each member of the parish can contribute. Whether it is teaching or helping with classes, making snacks, or decorating, this will be a week to use your time and talent(s) to specifically educate the children of this parish and other children who join with us. The whole parish will be encouraged later in the year to help out with Vacation Bible School so it is not the responsibility of just a few.

I would ask that each member of Christ the King pray about how he/she might help with the Education of the Youth here at Christ the King. Father Cooper and I will be there to support each individual in these positions that should be filled as soon as possible. Parents of EYC participants will be notified when the program restarts.

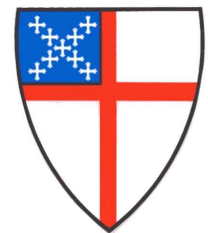
Parents are encouraged to bring their children to the Alternative Service in the late afternoon on Sundays.

Rite 13 is a program designed to prepare teenagers to become Christian Adults. This program teaches the tenants of our Episcopal faith and how to apply the teachings of the church in their daily lives. It prepares them to become adult members of our church. The leaders of this program in our church will make a two-year commitment and will have constant contact with these young people. If a problem needs solving, they have other Christian adults to help them see what their choices should be to resolve the problems. If any of you remember teenage years or know of a teenager currently, you know the more Christian mentors they have, the better.

"The Gathering": An Alternative Service of Holy Communion

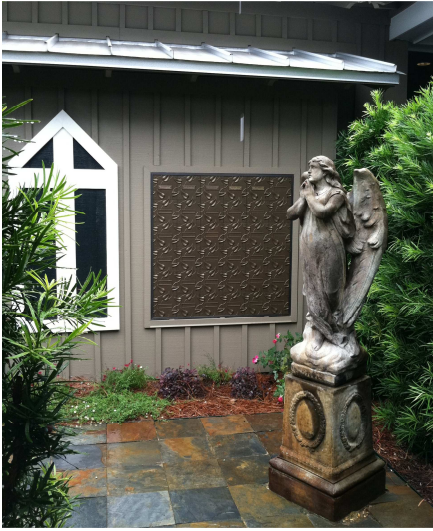
One of the unique and new opportunities to worship at Christ the King is "The Gathering." This worship is designed to blend traditional, ancient and contemporary styles of worship for both adults and children. Our worship in "The Gathering" is dynamic, fun and full of life. It appeals to both the best of the Episcopal tradition and the movement of the Holy Spirit in the life of the church.



"The Gathering" uses liturgical resources from the Book of Common Prayer as well as supplemental texts from *Enriching our Worship*. The congregation is actively involved in the worship with highly interactive prayers and corporate reflection on the scriptures rather than a formal sermon. The music is from contemporary as well as traditional hymnals characterized by energetic praise and quiet introspection.

The service is held in our parish hall, Sandefur Hall, on Sunday evenings beginning at 4:45 pm. Adults and children and youth of all ages are welcome. Refreshments and fellowship follow the service.

Columbarium Report

The mission of Caring & Sharing is to provide food and assistance to our neighbors in need through the support of volunteers and contributions. Yearly they have been able to assist more than 2,700 people with food, medication, rent, and utilities. Because of their food pantry, they are able to provide bags or groceries each week to families. They also are able to assist with diapers, formula, and infant clothing for new mothers. The funds generated by their Thrift Shop cover the operating expense and they proudly report that all donated funds go assisting those in need.

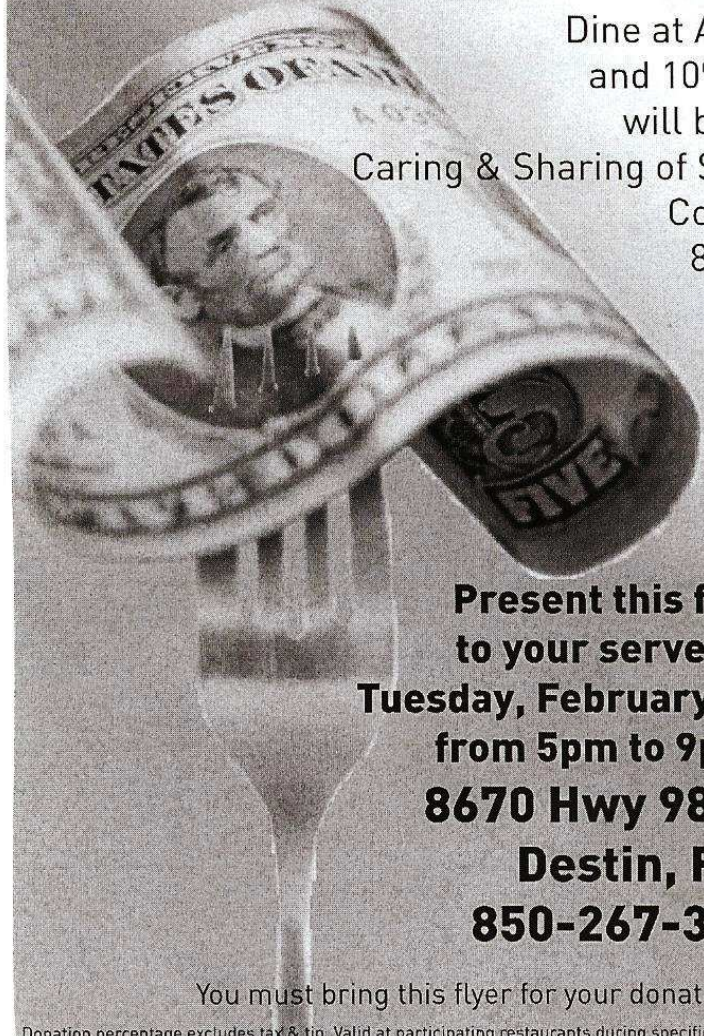

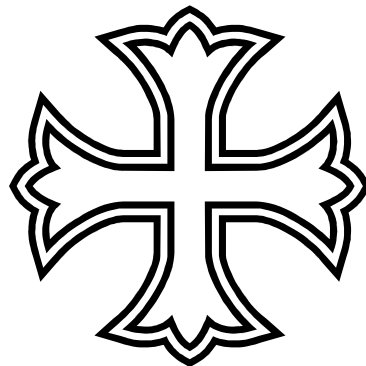

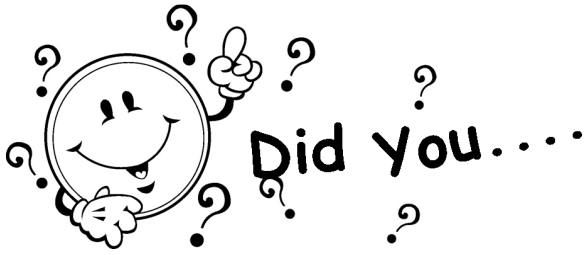

- The main kitchen contains 2 sinks, 2 garbage disposals, 2 dishwashers, 2 stoves, 2 microwave ovens, 2 refrigerators, 1 freezer, and 1 ice maker.
- In the sacristy there is a kitchen sink and in the flower room there is a kitchen sink and refrigerator.
- There are 7 A/C systems and 30 A/C filters.
- There are 300+ light bulbs in the buildings and walkways.
- There are 2 exterior moonbeam lighting systems. (Fixtures are up in the pine trees.)

SEARCHING FOR: PAWS Volunteers -- The PAWS (Pets are Working Saints)

program at Christ the King has resumed. Presently, we visit Grand Boulevard Healthcare in Sandestin on the 2nd Monday and the Walton County Convalescent Center in DeFuniak Springs on the 4th Tuesday of every month.

It is a known scientific fact that pets can lower heart rate and blood pressure, provide stress relief, lower anxiety and elevate mood! Pet visitation has many other positive purposes. It is one way we can show God's love and our love for others. Pets provide a means of communication and a relief from loneliness and the everyday routine. They also provide unconditional love, promote smiles, laughter, emotional well-being and can also satisfy the basic need to touch and be touched for both the residents and the staff of the facilities we visit. Oftentimes pets can break through barriers that people cannot.

This ministry is open to people with or without a pet. Pets do not have to be registered or certified as therapy animals but it is encouraged. The only requirements are that the pets be healthy, up to date on shots, be clean and well-groomed, be affectionate, get along well with people and other pets, be reliable and be under the handler's control. It is also helpful if the pet is not intimidated by loud noises or by people in wheelchairs or people using crutches or walkers.

Become a Member

Membership in the Episcopal Church is through Holy Baptism. Services of Baptism are offered throughout the year. Those who have been baptized may register their baptism in the Episcopal Church by informing the parish office. Those who were baptized at an early age in another communion and have not made a mature affirmation of their baptism may do so through Confirmation in the Episcopal Church. People who were baptized at a mature age in another communion may be received into the Episcopal Church by a bishop. In all of these instances, people are asked to participate in an Inquirer's Class.

Transferring Membership to Christ the King

Episcopalians and Lutherans who desire to transfer their membership registration to Christ the King may do so by contacting the parish office and expressing your desire. We will need to know the name and location of the church where your membership is presently held. If you have baptism and confirmation certificates available, we can make copies for you to hold in our files.

Reception

The service of reception is for those who have been both baptized and confirmed in another Christian denomination by a bishop in the historic episcopate but who wish to become Episcopalians. These persons would be "received" into the Episcopal Church at a service by a bishop. They are required to attend an Inquirer's class.

Confirmation

According to the Book of Common Prayer, "Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop." Confirmation is an "adult" affirmation of baptismal vows. Persons are confirmed at a service by a bishop.

At Christ the King, young persons are normally confirmed around the age of sixteen, after having been part of a special Christian formation program. Through confirmation, teenagers reaffirm the baptismal vows that their parents made for them when they were baptized as infants. Adults who wish to be confirmed are required to attend an Inquirer's class. Adults who are baptized by the bishop are then considered to be both baptized and confirmed at the same time.

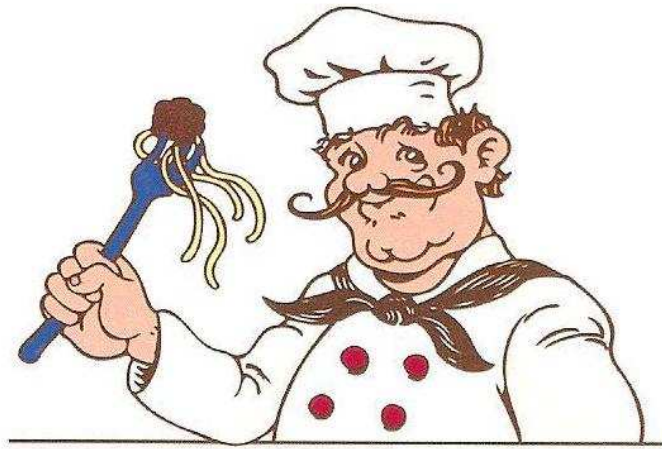

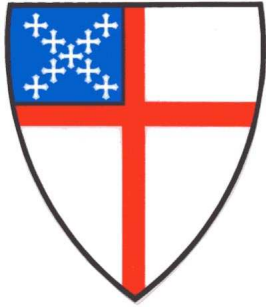
